




Choose a CSV List Separator For Your Locale

Different regions use different CSV list separators by default. To prevent issues when importing CSV data to Excel you can now tell us the list separator to use. We'll use the separator saved in your profile whenever you export CSV data from your account, for example when downloading data lists.

Edit your profile settings

Choose the Administration utility from the module picker. Then choose My Profile below your user name and click Edit. Enter the list separator you want to use, such as a comma (,) or semi-colon (;).




EC2 Scanning Improvements

Improvements have been made to the EC2 connector to allow scanning smaller (t1, t2, m1) instance types where allowed by Amazon scan policy.


Controls to Prevent Unauthorized Scanning

We understand the importance of controlling usage of the Qualys Scanner Appliances and confirming the appropriate authorizations are in place. Within the Qualys Cloud Suite, there are controls to prevent unauthorized scanning activity. A new confirmation message appears when adding web applications and web sites to WAS, WAF, MD and SECURE Seal. This message (shown below) explains that it is the user's responsibility to verify that they have permission to scan the web application or web site added.


Adding a web application in Web Application Scanning (WAS)




Adding a web application in Web Application Firewall (WAF)



Adding a web site in Malware Detection Service (MD)




Adding a web site in SECURE Seal



Build Nested Queries Around Vulnerabilities


This saves you time and gives you precise results! A nested query lets you search on multiple vulnerability fields. These same queries are supported using Qualys ThreatPROTECT. Keep in mind only 1 nested query (in parentheses) is allowed.

For example you might be interested in finding confirmed vulnerabilities that are severity 5.



Quickly Create a Widget from Your Query


The search box gives you the power and flexibility to search all of your assets instantly. Now you can transform your query into a widget on your dashboard. Once you have your query the way you want, just select "create widget" (1), customize how the widget looks (2), and click Add to Dashboard. That's it! We'll add the new widget to the dashboard you currently have open.

Feed articles will be marked **NEW** the first time you visit the Qualys real-time threat intelligence feed. Subsequently any new articles added since the last time you visited will be marked **NEW**.



New Cloud Agent Permissions

Now you can assign some or all permissions to subusers by editing user role permissions using the Administration utility. (All Managers are assigned all permissions by default as in previous releases.)

We've added 3 permissions groups

- CA Activation Key Permissions
- CA Configuration Profile Permissions
- CA Agent Permissions





Improvements to Activation Key Management

We've added options to help you edit, delete, enable/disable activation keys in your account. New options appear on the Quick Actions menu.



Want to take actions on multiple activation keys at once? No problem, just use the new options on the Actions menu. The options Delete, Disable/Enable will be available depending on the key settings. If any key has an agent, the Delete option is not available.



Good to Know

- What properties can I edit for a key? You can change the title, associated tags, enable/disable modules, and set limits.
- Want to delete a key from your account? This is possible only if the key has no active agents associated with it.
- What happens when I disable a key? You can still view the key, but you can't edit the key, or install agents using the key.

Select Columns for Your Agents List

Now you can customize the look of your agents list. The new Columns menu lets you choose what columns you'd like to display.
